Then all irrelevant data will be deleted and the constitution will be updated.

I'm sure all members would agree that he deserves to be highly commended. The time and effort he's devoted our club ensures we aren't kept in the dark. We are taking steps to relieve John of some of his workload we're very grateful to Martin Smith for volunteering to manage the external competitions next season. However, we would like a volunteer to assist, or take over John's role of Chairman.
